





Getting the most out of Homework Hound reporting When you initially log into Homework Hound as a teacher, you will land on this homepage. After your students have completed the first week of homework, you will be able to start analysing data. Across the top of the page, there are links to various reports. The Week Report will be emailed to you each week and it's the report you will use most often.



The Week Report is designed to provide you with a very quick and easy overview of your students' current strengths and weaknesses. It allows you to easily diagnose problem areas and solve issues to allow your students to move forward in the curriculum with confidence.



By selecting grid view, a grid will be displayed showing the areas that are causing challenge for each student. Use this information to help plan weekly literacy and numeracy rotations.

## Question: What do the colours represent on the Weekly Report?

Answer: We wanted to make it quick and easy to gather information so we've colour coded the reports.

Green = 85%+ Yellow = 65% - 84% Red = Below 65%

Students with yellow and red scores will usually be assigned a worksheet to provide practise and may require additional teacher input. The Week Report lets you really drill down deep to find out exactly what answers your students chose during their homework. For some students, they might need a reminder to slow down and reminded that correct answers equate to more bones to spend on rewards. It's a terrific motivator!

Not all students need this reminder. Some students, especially those with learning difficulties, will benefit from recognition for continued improvement and engagement. Consider asking parents to add more rewards that require fewer bones so you can ensure the student is constantly being recognised for their hard work and achievement.

By hovering over any sections within the Strengths and Weaknesses categories, you will be shown each student who falls within that category.

By clicking the symbol beside each student's result, a detailed report will drop down allowing you to view each section closely.



The Term Report is designed to provide you with an overview of results achieved across the Term. You can quickly see students who have missed any homework. You can also view the overall class strengths and weaknesses for each Term. You can also view a student's term overview where you are encouraged to leave regular comments to create a simple assessment record which can quickly be saved or emailed to staff. It's also a handy tool for parent teacher meetings.







The National Comparison is a powerful tool that provides a weekly benchmark of students around the country. You can easily see how your class results compare to other Australian States and Territories. It is designed to give you additional insight and provide you with ample time to remedy any problems you see well before NAPLAN testing occurs.

The Student Rewards module was introduced in Term 4 of 2014 and was incredibly successful. Student response was positive and we found that it triggered some fabulous results along with incredible opportunities to discuss teamwork and interpersonal skills. We know it works but it also relies on teachers using this feature. We recommend doing this first!



Adding rewards is easy and it is so powerful! In 2014 we found that students were highly motivated to complete homework to the best of their abilities when they knew rewards were waiting around the corner.

There are two types of rewards you can offer; **individual** rewards or class rewards.

Individual rewards are those that students can simply trade dog bones for.

Class rewards require students to "donate" bones towards the reward. Students choose how many dog bones to donate, how often they'll donate and whether they will choose to donate at all!

We've included a lot of ideas for you to look through and a downloadable PDF with even more ideas!

You'll probably find that a handful of students donate bones towards the prize while all classmates reap the reward. It creates a fantastic opportunity to begin a class discussion about fairness and equity. Consider a persuasive discussion or a debate. Younger classes may like to read the story "The Little Red Hen" and discuss the virtues of teamwork.

Parents can also enter rewards. When a student redeems a reward, it will show them from whom they are redeeming the reward. They will hand you the paper and you can simply scan the QR code to remove the points from the student's tally or log in and manually remove the points. Don't worry... it's very easy! The Spelling Module is new for 2015! Preloaded QLD C2C spelling lists are available for students to use each week for Years 1-6. However, you can easily override the preloaded lists by inputting your own spelling words for each week.

Settings have been put in place to ensure a consistency throughout the year. In Term 2 we will be introducing the option for teachers to move around homework sections to match their own scope and sequence as set by individual schools. However, a team of Australian senior teachers have worked to ensure weekly diagnostic tests prepare students for NAPLAN testing. In-built preparation for these tests begin in Term 4 and carry on throughout Term 1 in preparation for Term 2 NAPLAN tests.

You may choose to adjust settings at any point to suit your class needs.

You have control over whether you share parent reports with your students' parents each week. We recommend you provide weekly progress reports because it creates a connection between home and school that parents value. It also provides parents with a clear indication of what their child can do and what challenges they are currently experiencing. This alone can encourage parents to become part of a supportive educational team.



There are several settings you can alter for your students. The settings can be changed at any time. Select whether you would like students to complete each section of homework (6-10 questions) separately or complete the entire week of work as one long test.

You may decide you don't want students to see their own areas of greatest strength and challenge or you might not want them to receive feedback on answers.

The choice is yours!

Students are encouraged to personalise their backgrounds by changing colours and unlocking new images to make the Homework Hound experience their own.



Students will be able to access interactive games after Week 6 of using Homework Hound. We settle them into the routine before opening up the games which allow them to collect even more bones to trade. Students collect pieces of kibble for each correct answer in a game. 10 pieces of kibble = 1 bone to add to their rewards tally.





At this point, students will also be able to spend time in the music room listening to some funky new tunes, participate in competitions and display their artistic talents. We have a lot of fun activities lined up for students to enjoy!
